Autumn Term Newsletter

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been an exceptionally rewarding period this term at Hornchurch High School as we strive to accelerate academic standards. I extend my gratitude for the unwavering support received from everyone, especially under the guidance of the new leadership team. The recently announced 2023 year 11 examination results stand as the best in Hornchurch High's history, with the school's best progress score to date. Many students have progressed to esteemed post-16 institutions like the London Academy of Excellence. This achievement signifies the beginning of a journey towards further enhanced outcomes, and our vision is to be the best secondary school in Havering over the next three years.

Challenge Partners Quality Assurance Review

Hornchurch High School has partnered with Challenge Partners, a practitioner-led education charity accelerating school improvement, leadership development and pupil progress. Hornchurch High had its first Quality Assurance Review (QAR) $27^{th} - 29^{th}$ November, a three-day, rigorous peer evaluation of teaching and learning, curriculum and outcomes, and leadership at all levels. Led by an expert lead reviewer who is Ofsted trained, reviews are conducted by a team of headteachers/senior leaders from schools nationally.

I am pleased to inform you that were judged **effective** in all categories and **effective** in the overall peer evaluation judgement. These are some of the excerpts from the report:

- Raising the aspirations of all students is a key ambition of leaders. Senior leaders communicate their conviction that anything is possible through the school's motto, 'Excellence for All'. They have created an environment where staff and students feel part of a collective team that is working to improve the school.
- Through rigorous quality assurance processes, senior leaders have identified the correct priorities for improvement. Out of necessity, the school improvement plan is extensive with time-linked success criteria. Bringing a level of consistency to whole-school practices and processes has been fundamental to improving the school.
- Many of the school's systems and structures have been overhauled and renewed. A new behaviour policy, based on the school's values, has been introduced and follows a model of the best practice found nationally. Students behave very well in class and around the school and understand why this is important.
- Leaders have successfully created an atmosphere of trust between teachers and students. Students understand leaders' high expectations of behaviour. There is strict adherence to rewards and sanctions with a no-nonsense approach to how students will conduct themselves in and around the school.
- Students are provided with the correct equipment needed to actively participate in learning activities, with students even having a say on the type of writing pen to be used.
- Students take advantage of various educational visits to broaden their cultural and social experiences. For example, students visit the Royal Botanic Gardens at Kew, Tate Modern and Shakespeare's Globe Theatre, and are encouraged to take part in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme.

As a school, we also submitted an application for an Area of Excellence to be considered: 'Professional development – forms, mechanisms and sequencing', and I'm pleased to say that it was validated by







reviewer consensus. This means other schools nationally will be visiting Hornchurch High to observe best practice of professional development.

Head and Deputy Head Student Elections

At Hornchurch High School, every student actively participated in a democratic election process to choose their head students. At Hornchurch High we do what is right for our context and our students and this year we have diverged from the norm of having two head students, opting for three individuals this year. This unconventional decision was rooted in the belief that each of the three elected students brings a unique perspective to the table, thereby enhancing student representation. Through a thorough interview process where students had to present to their peers and attend a formal interview with a panel, the students showcased their dedication to representing the entire student body. I am proud to introduce that our Head Students for 2023 24 are Olivia, Connor and Amy. These three head students will play a crucial role in ensuring that the voices of students are heard in pivotal decisions and developments within the school. Acting as both internal and external ambassadors, they are poised to exemplify the values of Hornchurch High School and serve as role models for their peers. Their responsibility extends to reporting to the senior team and governors, reinforcing their integral role in the school's leadership structure.

In their reports, you'll find a target grade, a grade derived from their KS2 scaled scores, and a predicted grade. The predicted grade reflects what they could achieve at the end of Year 11 if they maintain their current level of dedication and effort.
