

## **Parent Guide: Using Languagenut for Homework**

This guide will help parents understand what Languagenut is, how children can log in, complete homework, and make the most of the platform.

### **What is Languagenut?**

Languagenut is an online language learning platform used by our school to support Spanish. It offers interactive activities to help students build vocabulary, grammar, and listening skills. It provides:

- Teacher-assigned homework tasks
- Listening, reading, writing and speaking exercises
- Games and quizzes for practising vocabulary

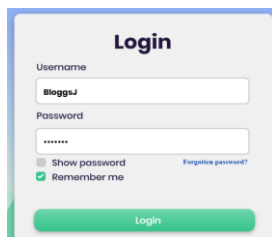
Automatic marking and progress tracking

### **How to Log In**

1. Go to <https://www.languagenut.com> in a web browser.
2. Click on 'Login'.

Enter the username and password provided by the class teacher. Surname (beginning with a capital letter) then initial of first name (in capital letter) no spaces. Password is unique to each child, all logins and passwords have been given out by class teachers.

4. Once logged in, your child will see their dashboard with their assignments.

If login doesn't work:

- Double-check the username and password from school.
- Ensure there are no spelling mistakes or extra spaces.
- Refresh the Languagenut web page.
- Contact the school if the account needs resetting.

### **How to Start and Complete Homework**

1. Go to the 'Assignments' section on the dashboard.
2. Click on the task set by the teacher.
3. Complete the activities, which may include matching games, listening tasks, or short quizzes.
4. Students often earn points or rewards for completing activities correctly.
5. Once finished, progress is automatically saved and shared with the teacher.
6. Extra practice is available by exploring other vocabulary and topic areas beyond homework.

### **Tips for Parents**

- Encourage your child to use headphones for listening tasks to improve focus.
- Sit with them occasionally to practise speaking tasks together.
- Remind them to repeat activities for reinforcement, (this can be added by the class teacher) especially in tricky vocabulary areas.
- Celebrate points or rewards they achieve to motivate them further.
- Encourage extra practice by exploring additional language topics outside of assigned homework.
