This guide will help parents understand what Seneca Learning is, how children can log in, complete homework, and make the most of the platform.


What is Seneca Learning?

Seneca Learning is an online learning and revision platform used by many schools across subjects, including maths, science, English, and more. It provides:

- Interactive revision lessons broken into small chunks
- Quizzes and practice questions with instant feedback
- Teacher-assigned courses and homework
- Progress tracking so teachers and parents can see how students are doing

How to Log In

- Go to https://senecalearning.com in a web browser.
- 2. Log in using your child's school Google/Microsoft account by clicking on 'Continue with Microsoft'.
- 3. Once logged in, your child will see the courses assigned by their teacher on the homepage.



If login doesn't work:

- Check with the school that the correct login method is being used.
- Ensure they are using the correct email address linked to their school account.
- Reset the password by clicking 'Forgot password?'

How to Start and Complete Homework

- I. Go to the 'Classes' or 'Assignments' section on the homepage.
- 2. Click on the homework set by the teacher.
- 3. Read through the interactive revision notes provided.
- 4. Answer the quiz questions at the end of each section.
- 5. Receive instant feedback on each answer and retry if necessary.
- 6. Once complete, progress is automatically saved and sent to the teacher.
- 7. Students can also access extra practice by revising other courses beyond homework tasks.

Tips for Parents

- Encourage your child to spread out homework and revision
- Sit with your child occasionally to see how Seneca works—it is very visual and interactive.
- Remind them to retry incorrect questions to reinforce learning.
- Check progress reports by asking your child to show you their assignment scores.
